Town Board Matters

The Town Board met with the Routt County Board of Commissioners at their March 23rd meeting. County Manager Tom Sullivan and Deputy County Manager Dan Weinheimer also joined the meeting. Updates were provided regarding the new combined law enforcement facility in Steamboat Springs, planning efforts at Tramway Park (Soroco Storage) site, affordable housing efforts, and the Town's upcoming Main Street construction project.

The Board also heard from a couple members of the public regarding the changes happening with regard to animal control services. The Town

will be using Bear Creek Animal Hospital and the Humane Society of Moffat County to manage the Town's limited animal holding needs for the Town in the future. More detailed information is included with this newsletter.

Other things that the Board of Trustees will be considering in future meetings are changes to the Town Code on metered water rates and the handling of tap fees. The Town is seeing some new residential construction activity, and updates to the water system requires some changes in the Code. Stay tuned!

Main Street Project Update



Dear Community Member

Starting March 17, 2017 the Town of Oak Creek will no long use Routt County Humane Society for animal control or welfare service. The Town will use the services of Dr. Hepworth and Bear Creek Animal Hospital in Craig, CO. Here is basic information to assist you.

Stray/At Large Dogs

OCPD will capture stray or at large dogs as we have in the past. We will use the information available from the dog's tags (TOWN of OAK CREEK license or name/number tags) to make every effort to notify the owner or to deliver the animal to its home. We will advertise the dog on Facebook (NAME) and hold the animal at Town Hall for a reasonable period of time.

Reasonable means that, if necessary, we can transport the dog to Bear Creek Animal Hospital in Crag in time to house them there and WILL vary from case to case.

If there is no response and a reasonable time has passed, the animal will be transported to Craig.

In order to claim your dog you must come to Town Hall and pay fees associated with impound BEFORE you go to Craig to pick your dog up.

Fees are:

\$25 first day shelter fee

\$20 vaccination fee (on a case-by-case basis but generally required if no tags are attached)

\$15 for each day/partial day of housing.

Animals will be held at the shelter in Craig for three or five days. Three days for animals with tags and five days for animals without. At the end of the shelter period, the animal will be made available for adoption. Your quick response to Craig to claim your animal is key.

If your animal is made ready for adoption, you'll be responsible for any and all costs associated with this process. Fees included spay/neuter, additional vaccinations, micro chipping and adoption fees as billed by the provider.

Before being able to claim your animal you must present proof of current Town of Oak Creek pet license or obtain one at the counter as you pay your shelter fees.

You may also be issued a summons to municipal court for dog at large and other violations.

Stray/At Large Cats

The Town will rarely provide services relating to cats/kittens. They are the responsibility of the property owner or animal owner. Fees for care of cats are high and are rarely recovered by the Town.

Injured Animals:

If we are unable to IMMEDIATELY contact the owner, injured animals, both dogs and cats, will be collected and transported to Craig on a case-specific basis. Minimal care and treatment will be provided by the animal hospital and all costs are to be paid directly to the clinic.

If we can contact you, you can direct the services we provide to your injured pet.

All other shelter fees and costs associated with the animal being at large (especially dogs) will be in place as well. All shelter fees must be paid before your pet will be released.

You may be issued a summons for dog at large and other violations if the case warrants it.

Found Dogs:

If you find a dog, please contact the police department through dispatch at 970-879-1090 and make a found animal report. You have the option of sheltering the dog at your home pending notification of the owner or having the police department respond to provide services. Regardless of your desire, please call dispatch so we can start the process of returning the dog to its home. We will respond to calls of injured dogs as best as possible. Do NOT transport the dog to the shelter in Steamboat Springs; you will not be able to leave them there.

Found Cats:

The Town will rarely provide services relating to cats/kittens. They are the responsibility of the property or animal owner. You have the option of sheltering the cat at your home and yard pending notification of the owner if possible. Generally, cats return to their home and are ok if left alone. You are welcome to call the police department through dispatch to make a found animal report. Do NOT transport the cat to the shelter in Steamboat Springs; you will not be able to leave them there.

Feral Cats:

Commonly referred to as wild-cats, feral will rarely receive any response from the Town. The cost of serving these animals is high and the Town rarely recovers the cost. Generally feral cats are the responsibility of the property owner. Please call the Town 970-736-2422 to discuss your options. Do NOT transport the cats to the shelter in Steamboat Springs; you will not be able to leave them there.

Lost Dog:

Please call the police department through dispatch at 970-879-1090 to report your dog as lost. This will help all of our service providers reunite you and your pet.

Please also call Routt County Humane Society. Though we do not utilize their shelter, it is possible your animal was recovered outside the Town limits and is housed at RCHS or they may have received a found animal report that Oak Creek has not received. Surrendered Animals:

Should you find that you are unable to care for your animal for any reason, you are able to surrender your pet through the Animal Hospital in Craig. There is a fee for this and they ask that you make an appointment. There are some forms to fill out and those are available at Town Hall. The forms help the adoption coordinators find a suitable home for your pet. The fee to surrender a pet is \$100. As a resident of the Town of Oak Creek, You cannot take your animal to the shelter in Steamboat Springs. It will not be accepted.
