Town Board Matters

On December 8th, the Town Board of Trustees approved and authorized the 2019 Budget. The Budget includes a trash and recyclables collection rate increase to \$28.00 for regular residential and \$19.00 for senior residential, as well as a rate adjustment for electricity of 7.2% in accordance with the recently completed Cost of Service Study. Soroco FFA Chapter: 2018 National FFA Convention

The Soroco FFA Chapter attended the 2018 National FFA Convention hosted in Indianapolis, Indiana.

The Chapter traveled with a total of 10 students, including: three sophomore students (earning their way to Nationals), two American Degree recipients, a State Champion livestock judging team, as well as a National Choir member. With considerable community support and many unique opportunities, the experience proved to be impactful for each member.

Gregory Rubalcaba, Makinley Parker, and Spencer Ashley were three members who, through yearlong participation in Chapter events, earned their trip. Students attended several sessions, observed business activities conducted by the National FFA Officer Team, listened to inspirational keynote speakers, witnessed the presentation of many prestigious awards, and had the privilege to attend a Garth Brooks concert (up close and personal) in the second row.

Caylee Hood and Morgan Palyo received their American Degree, the highest degree that can be awarded to a member, (less than 5% of our members receive it) meaning they completed a lengthy list of requirements regarding academic achievement as well as accomplishments within their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE).

The Soroco livestock evaluation team competed in the National contest and included Bailey Singer, Samuel Shaffer, Grace Olinger, and Kaetlyn Friedeman. As State winners, they spent two days taking tests, assessing reproduction and marketing scenarios, evaluating livestock, and providing justifications for their reasoning. Sam Shaffer received the bronze emblem, and from 250 contestants, Bailey Singer, Kaetlyn Friedeman, and Grace Olinger were gold emblem recipients. Grace Olinger was 1st in swine and reasons and 6th overall; Kaetlyn Friedeman was 19th overall, and Bailey Singer was 23rd overall. The team was in the gold category and finished 13th in the Nation. A special thanks to Rod Olinger for preparing and coaching this great group of students!
