Town Board Matters

The Town Board approved the 2021 Town Budget at their December 9th meeting. In accordance with state law the budget is balanced. The budget includes funding for Public Works/Streets & Stormwater, Police, Municipal Court, Parks, Recreation and Administration which are funded by a variety of taxes, including local sales and property taxes. The budget also provides funding for four enterprise funds: water, sanitary sewer, electricity and trash. The enterprise fund revenues are primarily paid for by user fees. Tax rates and utility fees will not increase in 2022 but user fees will increase for trash customers by approximately \$3.00 per month. To retain employees and be able to attract new applicants, the Board updated the wage schedule and provided a wage increase to offset the impact of inflation. At this Board meeting Melissa Dobbins was sworn in as Town Trustee and Jennifer Hewes was sworn in as Town Treasurer.

The next Town Board meeting will be held virtually and in-person on January 13, 2022 starting at 6 p.m., and we urge you to attend in person or from the comfort of your home via Zoom or Facebook.
