The Board members are concerned about the impact STR's have on neighborhoods, and the loss of homes from the long-term rental market. Long-term rental properties provide affordable housing for the local workforce and STR's provide housing for visitors to the region. Town Hall Solar Project Update

Earlier this year the Town, along with eight other North West Colorado municipalities, applied for a Regional Solar Project grant through the Colorado Department of Local Affairs. DOLA awarded the grant and the Town's project is to install a 20.5 kW-DC solar panel system on the Town Hall roof to provide electricity to Town Hall. It is estimated that this system will last 30+ years, provide carbon-free energy, save the Town approximately \$2,300 in annual energy expense, and reduce the Town Hall's energy consumption by 44%. To pay for the equipment, installation and three year's operation and maintenance service the Town paid \$25,256 and DOLA granted the Town \$81,230. Based on the projected annual savings of \$2,300 the Town's investment payback will be approximately 11-years. Contractors have been installing the solar panels on the Town Hall roof the past several weeks and it is anticipated the project will be completed prior to the Fall heating season.

A bit of Oak Creek's history . . .

Have you hiked the Noon Whistle Trail, located in the Town limits? Trailheads are located adjacent to the Mining Memorial on Main Street and at the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and 1st Street for this 1,041-foot long singletrack trail. The noon whistle used to blow every day at noon. According to an article published in the Steamboat Pilot, written by Nick Foster on July 5, 2003, residents reported that the whistle was not reliable enough to set clocks by. The whistle has been used as a warning if there was a fire or an accident in the mines, as a curfew for the Town's youths and as a warning whistle in case of attack during WWII. The Noon Whistle site was chosen on the hill behind the Old Town Hall, now the Tracks and Trails

Green Machine discontinued -

It is with regret that we must inform you that Routt County's Green Machine program will be discontinued starting in September 2021 for the following reasons:

- In the last couple of years costs have exceeded and continue to exceed budgeted funding (\$17,000 in 2020).
- Contamination rates often exceed 50% according to information from Waste Management.
- Recycling services now exist for most residents living in South Routt County.

Green Machine funding will be diverted to help support establishment of permanent drop-off locations for hardto-recycle items such as electronics and to fill gaps where recycling services are not offered.
