SUMMARY OF POSITION: Performing a wide variety of unskilled, semi-skilled and skilled work in all phases of maintenance including but not limited to; repair and construction of roads, flood control, public work's facilities such as electric systems, water/sewer treatment and distribution systems, TOOC buildings, parks and other related public work's programs.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

The following statements are illustrative of the essential functions of the job and do not include other nonessential or peripheral duties that may be required. The Town of Oak Creek retains the right to modify or change the essential and additional functions of the job at any time.

- Performs maintenance and construction work involved in the management of
 - Electric systems
 - Street Maintenance
 - Water and sewer treatment and distribution systems,
 - Parks and town building maintenance
 - Related public works programs.
- Respond in a timely manner to citizen needs for public works services as assigned by supervisor.
- Adhere to all Town safety and loss/control guidelines.
- Work is Monday through Friday, 40 hours per week, with a one (1) hour lunch break subject to change based on work load and scheduling.
- Work overtime as circumstances dictate.
- On call during non-business hours (on a rotating schedule) with the ability to report to duty within 30 minutes.

REPORTING RELATIONSHIPS

Direction is provided by the Public Works Director or designee.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES

- Basic public works maintenance practices, tools, and equipment; mechanical aptitude.

- Operating light and heavy equipment such as tools for tree trimming, lawn mowing and snow removal.
- Entry level knowledge of electrical power systems.
- Safe driving rules and practices.
- Manual labor including safe lifting and carrying practices.
- Possess or attain hot line training through a certified class within 6 months.
- Possess or attain a class B or higher Colorado Commercial Driver's license within 6 months of hire.
- No specific education requirement, but a journeyman level understanding in at least one construction craft or trade is essential.
- Read and write English at a level required for successful job performance.
- Follow oral and written directions; keep simple records.
- Work cooperatively with others.
- Willing to learn to perform duties of higher level positions; sound work ethics.
- Ability to treat customers/citizens with respect. Possess cultural awareness, sensitivity and to be consistent and fair.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

- Cold weather, wet environments, and vibration.
- Exposure to moving mechanical parts.
- Working environment may include high and precarious jobsites, fumes, dust, toxic or caustic chemicals and the risk of electrical shocks.
- Exposure to loud noises for prolonged periods.

PHYSICAL AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

- Frequently lift 25 lbs. and occasionally lift and or moves up to 100 lbs.
- Must possess good close distance, far distance and peripheral vision.
