The Town Board is considering if or how to allow people to drink alcohol in some or possibly all of the Town's parks. Recognizing that there are pro's and con's to this change in Town Code they are proceeding carefully. Presently organizations like our local Labor Day Committee obtain a special event permit from the Town Board each year, for each location where alcohol will be served. The Farmer's Market received a special event permit from the Town Board last summer, allowing alcohol to be served in the Main Street Park, next to the Farmer's Market. People frequently ask if alcohol can be served at memorial services held in Decker Park and are informed that they cannot have alcohol in any Town Park. Protect your pet, protect our community.

The Oak Creek Police Department has received an increasing number of complaints about off-leash and non-confined dogs. With the amount of snowfall this winter fences are not as high as they are in the summer months and people are reporting dogs walking over fences, either leaving residents yards, or getting into neighbors yards or the Town streets. The dogs are reported to be out of owner control when not on a leash. Town codes require all dogs to be leashed when not confined to their yard. There are no voice control provisions in the Town Code.

Please, license your pets so they can be returned quickly to you. Now is the time to ensure your companion animal is on a leash, vaccinated against rabies, licensed, and confined to your property as required. Licenses are available at Town Hall for the low price of \$3 for neutered or spayed pets and \$7 for intact pets. You'll need to bring proof of current rabies vaccination for your pet/s when you purchase your license(s).

Dogs who have bitten another animal or a human are subject to quarantine confinement at a shelter. Those charges are in excess of \$250.

Winter Use of Town Street Regulations

Winter is coming to an end, however snow will likely continue to fall and be here for awhile. Many people want to enjoy the use of their snowmobiles. Please remember that snowmobile use is prohibited on the streets and alleys in the Town of Oak Creek. We don't allow snowmobile use on our roads or alleys for a number of reasons, all of which relate to the safety of the user and others.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife have asked us to remind you that snowmobiles need to have registration stickers. The fees fund search and rescue efforts and create more and better trails for those who enjoy these machines. Registering your snowmobile also aids in recovery and return of stolen sleds.

Please help snow removal by:

Obeying the signs on Main Street and North Sharp Ave.

Reminder: No parking from 2:30 am -6am. Please obey the signs on Oak Ridge Circle.

Reminder: No street parking allowed during winter months

Reminder: Town right-of-way is wider than the pavement. If your vehicle is at the street end of your driveway, it's in the right-of-way. Please park as far off the roadway as possible

Please move your vehicle to a plowed section of roadway every 24 hours whenever we receive 3 inches of snow or more.
