Town Board Matters

During the month of May, the Town Board has renewed several marijuana business licenses and liquor licenses, including updating the Town code to reflect voter approved changes to the marijuana and liquor codes. This is important to the Town as these businesses provide employment for local residents, provide a variety of entertainment opportunities such as music and pool competitions, provide convenient places for people to eat out and shop locally, and provide sales tax income that pays for Town services such as street and park maintenance, police services, snow removal, downtown flower displays, public storm water drainage systems and other vital and non-vital services. The Town Board also approved several regular special events such as the July 15th South-by-South Routt event that will be held at Decker Park and the annual Labor Day activities. Please participate in the Town's annual Clean-up Day on June 3rd. And, please remember to secure your trash and birdfeeders from bears.

Town Clean-Up Day

Located at the Town's Public Works facility – 618 Lillian Lane. The Town Clean-up day will be held on **Saturday, June 3rd from 8:30am – 1:00pm** or until the dumpsters are full, whichever happens first. Town residents may dispose of two pick-up loads at \$5.00 per load. As the services are limited to Oak Creek residents, please bring a copy of your utility bill.

Tires will be taken for a \$10 per tire fee. There will be an area for steel, appliances and other metal recyclables.

- Used oil and vehicle fluids- NO
- Refrigerators/Freezers/Air conditioners, unless tagged "Freon Free" **NO**
- Liquid Wastes- **NO**
- Pesticides/Herbicides- NO
- Mattresses/Box Springs- NO
- Couches/Overstuffed Chairs- NO
- E-waste, such as TV's, monitors, backup batteries, surge protectors and computers-NO

Years ago, our elected representatives decided that, for the good of all, to limit the types of fireworks that can be purchased, possessed, and used in Colorado. The law basically says: if it goes "Bang" or "Boom" it's illegal; and/or, if it leaves the ground or parts of it can travel, it's illegal. This means no roman candles or bottle rockets; ground fountains with sparks are generally okay. Remember that fire restrictions can be imposed at any time and with little notice. restrictions often come with rules against lighting ANYTHING, even otherwise legal fireworks.
