Town Board Matters

- Renewed liquor licenses for Bonfiglio's and Spiro's.
- Discussed how to build a sustainable workforce in today's South Routt workplace.
- Received an update on activities from Yampa Valley Sustainability Council officials.
- Held a public hearing and heard from developers regarding a proposal to build four duplex structures on Lot 15 of the Sierra View subdivision. The proposal was continued.
- Andrea Fasen, P.E., W.W. Wheeler & Associates, Inc. presented updates on the Sheriff Reservoir Engineering
 and Construction activities. Ms. Fasen reported that headgate replacement construction is underway and
 spillway engineering is anticipated to be completed by December 2023.
- Reviewed State voter approved Prop 123 and what steps the Town must take to participate in these funding programs for workforce housing development.

Trash and Recycling Changes, effective November 1st

Waste Management will begin providing trash and recycling services to Town residents in early November so there will be a changeout in your carts. If you have, or want to start having, more than one cart (same size) for either trash or recycling (or both), and/or if you want a bear proof cart, please contact Town Hall, 970-736-2422, to let staff know your service address and the number of carts desired. You can email staff if this is easier at billing@townofoakcreek.com. The monthly fee for additional carts are \$13.93 – trash and \$13.11 – recycling. Bear proof carts will also be available for an additional cost of \$20 per month. Please contact the Town by noon Friday, October 13, 2023 with this information to avoid a \$50 cart dropoff charge; we'll be glad to help you.

ISO Fire Score Improves

Contact your homeowner's insurance company; this new ISO rating can mean lower rates. A company called the ISO (Insurance Services Office) creates ratings for fire protection departments and their surrounding communities. The ratings calculate the fire suppression capability of fire departments and the department's fire loss experience. provides this score, often called the "ISO fire score," to homeowner's insurance companies. The Town has been advised by ISO that Oak Creek Fire is rated a classification rating of 3, a classification attributed to the top 32% of fire departments in The Town's water supply and the needed fire flow that can be provided at one time makes up 40% of the ISO score. The Town's water supply plus the fire district's preparedness plus the communications County's emergency contribute to the ISO rating. Bottom line, the team that provides fire protection for Town residents is highly rated and valued, kudos to the employees and officials providing us with these great services.
